

THE MISSION

Having established that not every believer can be a Christian Missionary, but every believer must be a Missionary Christian, it is important to clearly understand "The Mission." Itinerate missionaries are often misunderstood as a result of the necessity of having multiple church partnerships. Their ministry and influence extends beyond the realm of one local church. This in no way means they will not have a Pastor or local church from which they are based.

Our modern missionary environment has ample opportunities for all types of missionaries to be very active. The field missionary lives on the field and establishes a permanent residence with the mission field in question.

The itinerant missionary comes to the field to complete a project of some kind. The length of time often varies depending on the need and the project. Upon the completion of the training, or project they move on to the next location or return to home base to prepare the next mission or assignment.

Contemporary missions is leaning more toward placing the responsibility for evangelism, church planting and discipleship upon the benefited indigenous population.

Under this contemporary philosophy of missions, the work of the missionary is to equip the indigenous leadership and church to do the ongoing work of the ministry (Eph. 4:11). More

and more, even field missionaries, who live on the field among the people group in question, realize that their emphasis must be on equipping local believers to do the work of the ministry. This ensures fruit that remains with lasting impact.

DIFFERENT TYPES OF CHRISTIAN MISSIONARIES

Field missions (aka foreign based) missions

Work that is carried out or done outside of one's national boundaries (Mark 5:19,20; Luke 8:38-39; John 1:36-50, 4:28-30).

Home missions

Work that is carried out or done inside one's national boundaries (Mark 1:3539; Luke 8:22-25; Acts 1:8, 8:5-8, 16:1; Gal. 4:4, 34-37).

Itinerate missions

The itinerant missionary differs from foreign based missionary or home missionary that is based in one location, in that an itinerant missionary moves from nation to nation, perhaps randomly as the Lord leads, or in a regular scheduled circuit.
